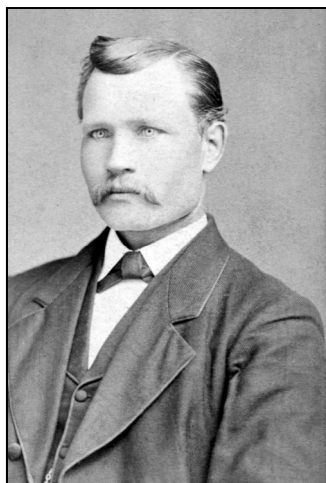


CHAPTER FIVE

Frederick and Johanna Reinhold's Children And Their Spouses

Frederick and Johanna Reinhold had seven children.¹ Six of their seven children were Carl Oscar Enqvist, Anders Johan Enqvist, Johan Fredrik Enqvist, Christine Sophia Enqvist, Johanna Charlotta Enqvist and Anna Marie Reinhold.² Anders Johan Enqvist died shortly after his birth while Frederick and Johanna were still living in Sweden.³ Five of their six children were born in Sweden and one child was born in the United States. There is no information on one of the seven children.

Charles Oscar Reinhold, the oldest of Frederick and Johanna's children, was born Carl Oscar Enqvist on October 27, 1853 in Pelarne parish, Kalmar County, Sweden.⁴ Johanna Reinhold was 19 years old when she gave birth. Charles came to Illinois from Sweden in 1869 with his parents at the age of 16.⁵ He was confirmed in Princeton, Illinois at the First Lutheran Church in 1870.⁶ On October 14, 1878, at the age of 25, he became a naturalized citizen at the Bureau County Courthouse in Princeton, Illinois.⁷ The name on his immigration petition is Charles O. Reinhold.⁸

On September 10, 1879, Charles Reinhold married Carrie Anderson in Concord, Illinois.⁹ He was 26 years old and Carrie was 29.¹⁰ Their marriage license indicates Charles and Carrie were born in Pelarne, Sweden.¹¹ The marriage license indicates Telarne, but probably the person filing out the marriage license misspelled Pelarne, writing a T instead of a P. The witnesses on the marriage certificate were Andrew and Anna Lundquist.¹² The minister was J. Wikstrand.¹³ Anna Lundquist was Carrie's half sister.

Isaacson who are known to be citizens of the United States, that the said applicant arrived in the United States a minor under the age of twenty-one years, has resided within the limits and under the jurisdiction of the United States, for and during the full term of five years, including the three years previous to his arrival at the age of twenty-one years, and one year within the State of Illinois; that, during said term of five years, he has sustained a good moral character, and appeared to be attached to the principles contained in the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; and the said applicant having now here filed his declaration of intention to become a CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, according to the provisions of the several Acts of Congress heretofore passed on that subject; and he having now here in open Court taken and subscribed the oath required by those laws, to support the Constitution of the United States, and to renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and more particularly all allegiance which he may in anywise owe to the King of Sweden & Norway whereof he was heretofore a subject.

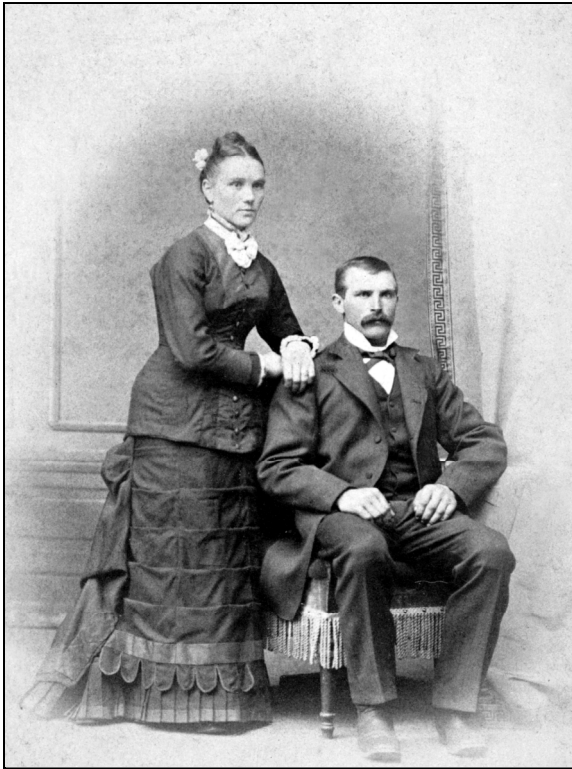

CHARLES REINHOLD AND CARRIE (ANDERSON)
REINHOLD
WEDDING PICTURE

Carrie Anderson was born Karna Jönsdotter on July 15, 1849 in Krestianstad County, Sweden.¹⁴ Her last name in Sweden was Jönsdotter because her father was Jöns Andersson.¹⁵ In American, Carrie went by the name Carrie Anderson. No one knows why she choose Carrie as her first name, but her father's last name was Anderson. She may have changed her name after arriving in the United States since ö is difficult to pronounce in English.¹⁶ It is Kenneth Larsson's opinion that Karna Jönsdotter changed her first name to Carrie because Karna was too Swedish and Carrie is a common American name.

Kenneth Larsson explained the Swedish name tradition as follows:

Farmer (most people) used patronymics as their children's last name, for example Anders Persson's son was called Nils Andersson (Ander's son) and the daughter Stina would be called Andersdotter (Ander's daughter). In the beginning of the 20th century children took their father's last name as their last name, for example Stina Persson (the Per's son had lost it's meaning).

Carrie Anderson's sister from her mother's first marriage was Anna Jönsdotter born July 31, 1847.¹⁷ Anna was Carrie's full sister.¹⁸

Carrie's brothers and sisters from her mother's second marriage were

Per Olsson born August 18, 1853; Jöns Olsson born April 26, 1855; Anna Olsdotter born May 22, 1857; and Elna Olsdotter born July 15, 1859.¹⁹ Jöns, Anna and Elna emigrated to the United States with Carrie's mother and her second husband on June 8, 1865.²⁰

In 1864, when Carrie Anderson was 14-15 years old, she moved to Venestad in Träne, Sweden where she was a servant at a farmer's house.²¹ In 1868, when she was about 20-21, Carrie moved to another farmer's house in Venestad.²² Then, on October 26, 1871, she moved to the parish Åhus, at farm No 1 in a place called Yngsjö.²³ When she emigrated to the United States on August 19, 1874, she was 25 years old, single having never been married and she had no children.²⁴

Evelyn (Reinhold) Peterson recalls being told by her mother that Carrie (Anderson) Reinhold had a son prior to marrying Charles Reinhold. Evelyn also recalls the following:

Carrie either gave birth to the boy prior to coming to America or after arriving, most likely after arriving. In any case, Carrie (Anderson) Reinhold worked for a family in Princeton, Bureau County, Illinois by the name of Johnson. Carrie probably work as a maid for the family and she had the boy with her while she worked. According to Evelyn, the Johnson family loved that boy and either legally adopted him or simply raised the boy as their own. Lena (Johnson) Reinhold new of this boy. It was perfectly normal at the time for young girls in Sweden working as maids to become pregnant by young men also working in the households or farms. Carrie (Anderson) Reinhold's son's name was Cary Johnson. He was given, the name Cary after his birth mother and the name Johnson for the people who raised him. The boy was apparently quite brilliant and went on to become a United States district attorney. The local papers cried out Cary Johnson in the newspaper's headline to show his brilliant achievements. Apparently, he was the community's favorite son and the Reinhold family followed his achievements also.

No evidence was found in Bureau County that Carrie (Anderson) Reinhold gave birth to a son prior to marrying Charles Reinhold.²⁵ Carol Shipp found a Cary Johnson who was adopted and an attorney, but the facts surrounding his life indicate he was not Carrie (Anderson) Reinhold's son. In addition, the 1900 Census for Westburg Township, Buchanan County, Iowa indicates that Carrie only gave birth to four children.²⁶ Those children were born to her and Charles. If Carrie had a child born to her prior to her marriage to Charles, the information regarding that child is lost forever.

Charles and Carrie Reinhold appear on the 1880 Census for Manlius Township, Bureau County, Illinois. Charles is age 27 and Carrie is 28.²⁷ Charles' occupation is listed as a farmer and Carrie's is keeping house.²⁸ No children are shown, but Carrie's mother, Bengta Malm, is living with Charles and Carrie.²⁹ Bengta Malm is identified as Rebecca Malm, age 55 and no occupation is listed.³⁰ Charles had an 18 year old male working as a farm laborer and living in Charles' household.³¹ The 1880 Census indicates that Charles, Carrie and Bengta Malm were all born in Sweden, and Bengta's parents were also born in Sweden.³²

After their marriage in 1879, Charles and Carrie first farmed near Wyanet, Illinois.³³ While farming near Wyanet, Charles and Carrie Reinhold gave birth to four children—Frank, born June 22, 1880;³⁴ Hilma, born November 19, 1882;³⁵ Carl Oscar, born March 22, 1885;³⁶ and William Theodore, born April 8, 1887.³⁷ Later, William went by the name Theodore and Carl Oscar went by Oscar. All four children were born near the City of Wyanet, Bureau County, Illinois.³⁸

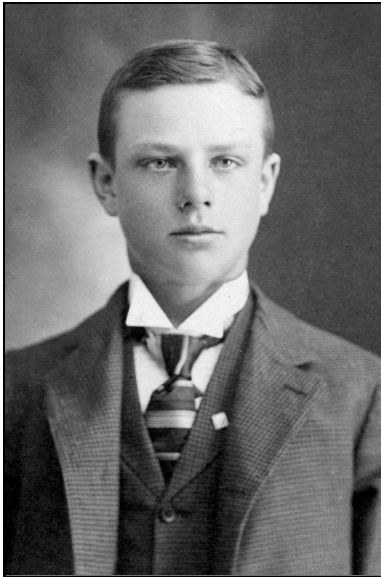

On March 1, 1900, the Charles Reinhold family moved to a farm in Westburg Township, Iowa³⁹ from Wyanet, Illinois.⁴⁰ When Charles moved his family to Iowa, Charles' son, Carl Oscar, was about fifteen or sixteen years old.⁴¹ No one knows why Charles Reinhold moved his family to Iowa. When Carl Oliver Reinhold and Carrie Lucille (Reinhold) Kerns were asked, they said, they had no idea. They went on to say they did not recall ever being told why Charles moved, or even hearing why he moved. Evelyn (Reinhold) Peterson and Dorothy (Reinhold) Nicholas did not know why Charles moved.

Charles and his family appear on the 1900 Census for Westburg Township, Buchanan County, Iowa.⁴² The Census was taken June 1 & 2, 1900.⁴³ Charles is listed as head of household.⁴⁴ His date of birth is listed as October 1854 and his place of birth is listed as Sweden.⁴⁵ Both of his parents' places of birth are listed as Sweden.⁴⁶ His occupation is listed as farmer and his age is listed as 45 years.⁴⁷ According to the Census, he immigrated to the United States in 1869, lived in the United States 31 years and could read, write and speak English.⁴⁸ The Census indicates that he was renting the farm on which he was living.⁴⁹ Carrie is listed as Charles' wife and the Census indicates they were married for 21 years.⁵⁰ According to the Census, Carrie was born July 1849, was 50 years old and had four children, all of whom were living.⁵¹ The Census also indicates that Carrie was born in Sweden, and that both of her parents were born in Sweden.⁵² Carrie could speak English, but could not read or write English.⁵³

All four of Charles and Carrie's children were living with them when the 1900 Census was taken.⁵⁵ Frank E. was born June 1880 in Bureau County, Illinois and was 19 at the time.⁵⁶ His occupation is listed as farm laborer and he could read, write and speak English.⁵⁷ Hilma A. was born November 1882 in Illinois and was 17 at the time.⁵⁸ She is listed as being in school and could read, write and speak English.⁵⁹ Carl Oscar was born March 1885 in Illinois and was 15 at the time.⁶⁰ He is listed as being in school and could read, write and speak English.⁶¹ Theodore was born April 1887 at Wyand, Illinois and was 13 at the time.⁶² He is listed as being in school and could read, write and speak English.⁶³ Theodore's legal name was William Theodore Reinhold, and Oscar C.'s legal name was Carl Oscar Reinhold.

On February 27, 1908, Charles Reinhold purchased an 80-acre farm near Winthrop in Section 11 of Liberty Township, Buchanan County, Iowa for \$6,000.⁶⁴ His wife's name does not appear on the deed. In the Winter of 1908, he and his family settled on the farm.⁶⁵ In 1908, William Theodore apprenticed as a carpenter and constructed a new house on this farm.⁶⁶ It was the first house he ever built.⁶⁷

Evelyn (Reinhold) Peterson explained that the farm work done on the Charles Reinhold's farm was primarily done by hand or with horses. She doubted that Charles had any mechanical equipment. She went further saying she doubted that Charles even saw anything mechanical. She explained that one year, her mother, father and her were visiting Charles and Carrie in the fall and Charles was picking corn by hand and throwing it in a buckboard. She went on to say that wheat and rye were sown by hand and cut by hand using a scythe. Later, she said, the crops were cut with a horse drawn mower and still later, with a binder.

William appears in the 1909 Moline City Directory.⁶⁸ William Theodore does not appear on the 1910 Census for Liberty Township, Buchanan County, Iowa.

Charles and Carrie Reinhold appear on the 1910 Census for Liberty Township, Buchanan County, Iowa.⁶⁹ Only two of their four children were living with them at that time.⁷⁰ They were Carl Oscar, age 25 and Frank Reinhold, age 30.⁷¹ Charles was 56 years old and Carrie was 60.⁷² The Census shows that Carrie and Charles were married for 34 years and that both were from Sweden, and both of their fathers and mothers were from Sweden.⁷³ The Census indicates that Carl Oscar and Frank were born in Illinois.⁷⁴

Hilma lived with her parents most of the time while she was in Buchanan County. She worked as a housekeeper and servant in Iowa. The 1910 Census for Liberty Township, Buchanan County, Iowa shows Hilma Reinhold age 24, single and living by herself.⁷⁵ Her occupation is listed as servant.⁷⁶

Frank Edward appears on the 1910 Census for Liberty Township, Buchanan County, Iowa as living with his parents on their farm in Westburg Township until he married Anna Laura Roof in 1910.⁷⁷ He worked as a bridge contractor. Frank died unexpectedly on August 26, 1922.

Carl Oscar appears on the 1910 Census for Liberty Township, Buchanan County, Iowa as living with his parents. Prior to getting married to Nora Decker on May 29, 1913 in Independence, Iowa,⁷⁸ he worked in different parts of the United State and Canada, including various cities in Iowa and Minnesota.⁷⁹ He worked in the Red River Valley of North Dakota as a carpenter and general farm laborer and traveled up to Winnipeg and Saskatchewan Province, Canada working as a carpenter. He sent Nora Decker numerous postcards from 1909 through 1913 as he travelled.

In September 1913, Carl Oscar and Nora were living in Oelwein. Carl Oscar was working as a boiler-maker's helper. By September 1914, he was renting a farm in Fayette County and later in Buchanan County. In September 1919, Carl Oscar purchased a 80-acre farm in Wisconsin for \$13,000 and in March

1920, he moved on to that farm. Carl Oscar knew land was cheaper in Wisconsin, and maybe that is why he did not buy his parent's farm. Still, one has to wonder why he didn't buy his father's 80-acre farm. In 1923, Charles and Carrie Reinhold sold their farm and moved to their home in Winthrop.⁸⁰ Charles was 70. Charles and Carrie's house was across the street from William Theodore Reinhold's first house, the brown house.⁸¹

Theodore was inducted into the military on March 11, 1918 and married Maude Lowella on June 15, 1921, after which they move to their home in Winthrop. Theodore worked as a carpenter.

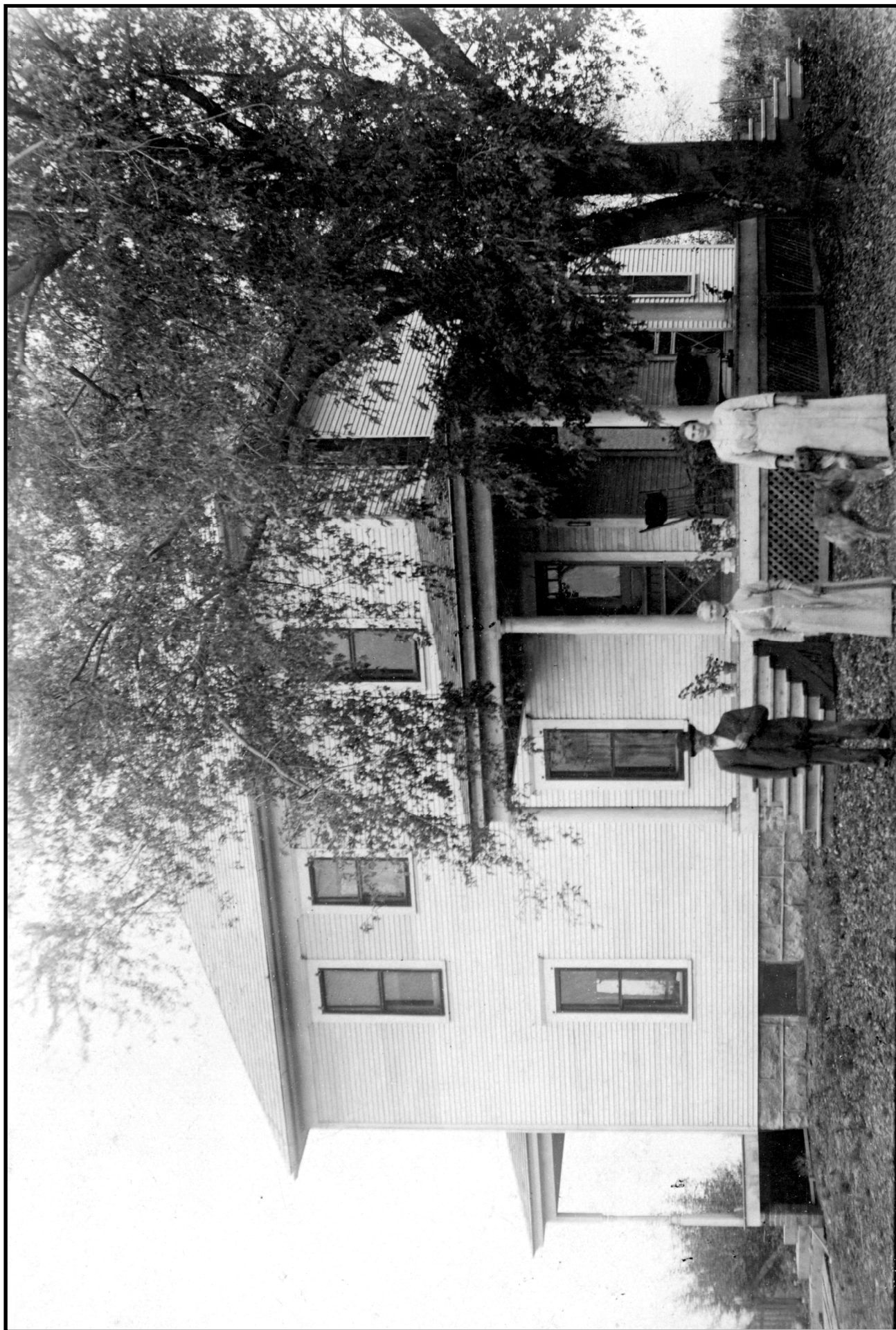

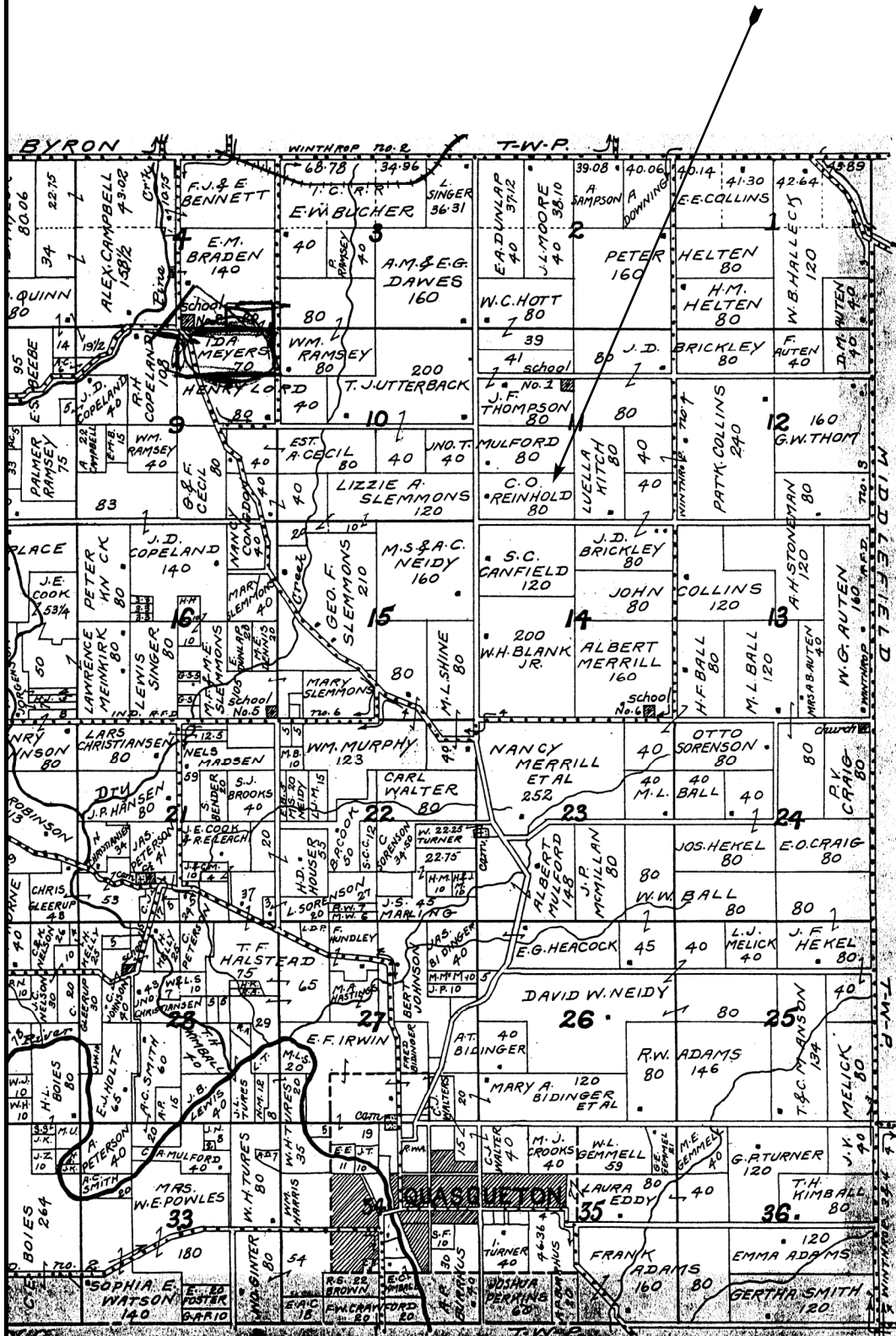

The 1925 Census for Buchanan County, Iowa shows Charles Reinhold, age 71 and Carrie Reinhold, age 75 and living alone.⁸³ The Census shows Charles' father's name was Frederick Reinhold and his mother's name was Johanna Aroson.⁸⁴ The Census also indicates that Carrie Reinhold's father's name was John Anderson, but the Census does not indicate what Carrie's mother's name was.⁸⁵

After Charles and Carrie Reinhold sold their farm in Iowa, they went to California, probably for the winter, or in any event for an extended period of time.⁸⁶ It is unknown when they left for California or where they lived in California.⁸⁷ While there, Charles apparently left the house a lot, so when the mail came, Carrie would ask her neighbor to read the mail to her.⁸⁸ Carrie could not read or write English.⁸⁹ Apparently, this went on for some time and the neighbor must have also written letters for Carrie.⁹⁰ In any event, the neighbor wrote to Hilma and Theodore in Iowa and explained the situation with respect to their parents.⁹¹ As a result, Hilma decided to go to California and help her parents.⁹² Later, Charles and Carrie return to Iowa to take care of business matters related to the sale of their farm.⁹³ The person who purchased Charles and Carrie's farm defaulted on the mortgage.⁹⁴ They return to Winthrop to settle the matter.⁹⁵

After the default, Charles and Carrie Reinhold kept the farm, eventually leasing it to a tenant.⁹⁶ Their son, Theodore, managed the rental property for his parents.⁹⁷ When Charles died, the farm was in his estate.⁹⁸ Theodore eventually bought out Carl Oscar Reinhold, Hilma Reinhold, and Frank Reinhold's interest in the farm.⁹⁹

In their later year, and after returning from California, Charles and Carrie Reinhold still took trips. They visited their son, John, in Colorado.¹⁰⁰ On one trip, Charles and Carrie had their picture taken on a donkeys.¹⁰¹ The picture was taken near Balanced Rock and Steam Boat in Colorado.¹⁰²

Carrie Lucille (Reinhold) Kerns also recalls that Charles Oscar and Carrie Reinhold coming to Carl Oscar and Nora Reinhold's farm in Medford, Wisconsin in the fall, about at the time when raspberries are ripe. Carrie Lucille remembered that Charles enjoyed picking raspberries and would pick berries twice a day – once in the morning and again in the afternoon. Generally, he picked two buckets full, which, when canned, equaled about 100 quarts of raspberry jam. Once Charles brought the raspberries back to the house, Carrie helped Nora Reinhold can the raspberries. To listen to Carrie Lucille tell the story, one can easily determine those visits and activities were very pleasant for the family members, not to mention the amount of raspberry jam that the family had to eat.

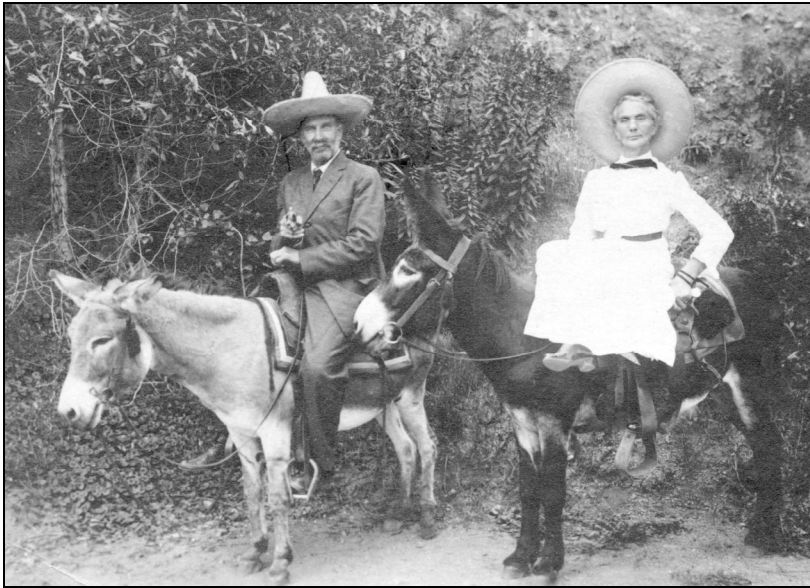

CHARLES AND CARRIE (ANDERSON) REINHOLD

Charles Oscar Reinhold's son, Carl Oscar Reinhold, was Carl Oliver Reinhold's father. Carl Oliver Reinhold recalls his grandfather visiting their family on their farm in Medford, Wisconsin. Carl Oliver recalls his father describing Carl Oliver's grandmother, Carrie, as a sweet, thin, little lady with white hair; and his grandfather, Charles, as an ornery, old man who did considerable drinking in his day. Carl Oliver Reinhold also remembers his father commenting that when Charles was drunk, he was mean, and very mean to his children. He also remembers his father saying that when Charles was in town drinking, Charles would complain that his horse did not go fast enough to get him home so he could cuss out the kids for not having the chores done. Carrie Lucille (Reinhold) Kerns also recalls Charles being a

heavy drinker and being told by his doctors that if he did not stop drinking his liver would give out. According to Carrie Lucille, Charles eventually stopped drinking for that reason.

Carrie (Anderson) Reinhold died of senility on November 21, 1927 at the age of 78 years, 4 months and 6 days.¹⁰³ She was a member of the Lutheran Church.¹⁰⁴ She never learned to read or write English.¹⁰⁵ She was a housewife¹⁰⁶ and the Winthrop News¹⁰⁷ noted on her death that, "She was a kind wife and mother, being of an unusually sunny disposition, going about her work with a song upon her lips and ever having a kind word for others."¹⁰⁸ Internment was in the Fairview Cemetery in Winthrop, Iowa¹⁰⁹ on November 22, 1927.¹¹⁰

June 16, 1929 at 8:30 am on Sunday morning, Charles Reinhold died of Chronic Myhritis at the Peoples Hospital in Independence, Bashington Township, Buchanan County, Iowa.¹¹¹ His age was 75 years, 9 months and 19 days.¹¹² On June 16, 1929, Charles was buried in Fairview Cemetery in Winthrop.¹¹³ Charles Reinhold died intestate.¹¹⁴ His next of kin included his sister, Hilma Bordwell of Wilmington, California; his son, Carl Oscar Reinhold of Medford, Wisconsin; his son, William Theodore Reinhold of Winthrop, Iowa and his four minor grandchildren (Frank Reinhold's children): Frank Reinhold, age 18; Gladys Reinhold, age 16; William Reinhold, age 12 and Francis Reinhold, age 6.¹¹⁵

Charles Oscar Reinhold's estate totaled \$12,981.20.¹¹⁶ His funeral expenses were \$296.50.¹¹⁷ The grave digging fee was \$10 and Charles' next of kin received the amounts shown in the table below.¹¹⁸

Carl Oscar Reinhold signed the application to have Theodore Reinhold appointed administrator for their father's estate.¹¹⁹ In addition, Frank Reinhold's wife, Anna Reinhold, was appointed guardian of Frank Reinhold's children while Theodore Reinhold was appointed guardian of Frank Reinhold's children and property.¹²⁰

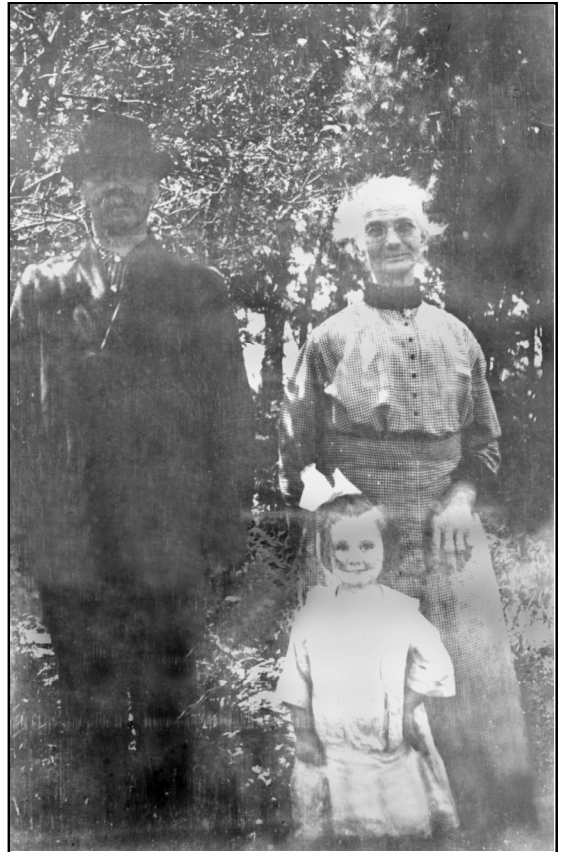

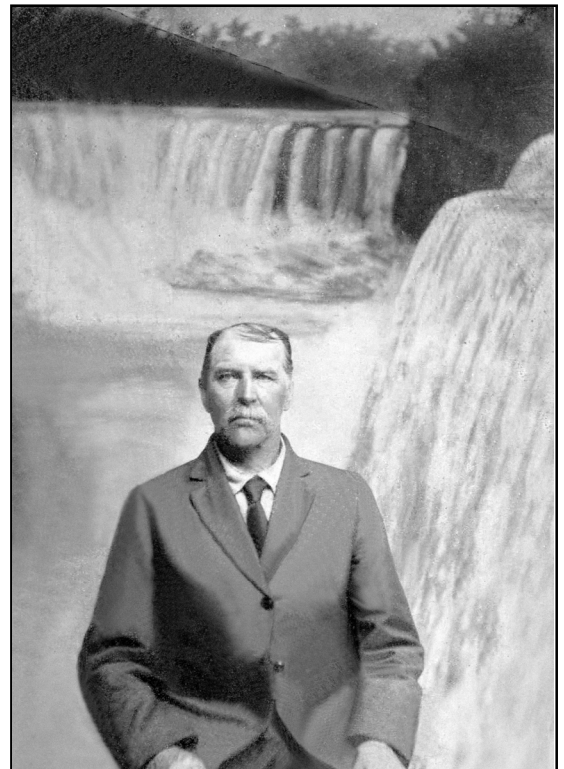



Charles O. Reinhold Died

Peoples Hospital Sunday

Charles O. Reinhold was born in Calmar, Sweden, Oct. 27, 1853, and passed away at the Peoples hospital in Independence Sunday morning, June 16, 1929, at 8:30 o'clock.

He came from the old country to Illinois with his parents in 1869 at the age of sixteen, and was married to Carrie Anderson Sept. 10, 1879, at Wyanet, Ill. He came to Iowa March 1, 1900, and in the winter of 1908 settled on his farm near Winthrop, moving to Winthrop in 1923, where he has since resided.

His wife preceded him in death Nov. 21, 1927. A son, Frank E., of Quasqueton, passed away Aug. 26, 1922. He leaves to mourn three children—Mrs. Hilma A. Funeral services, conducted by Rev. H. W. Arman, of the M. E. church, were held from the Theodore Reinhold home Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Burial was made in Fairview cemetery. The many friends of the family extend sympathy.

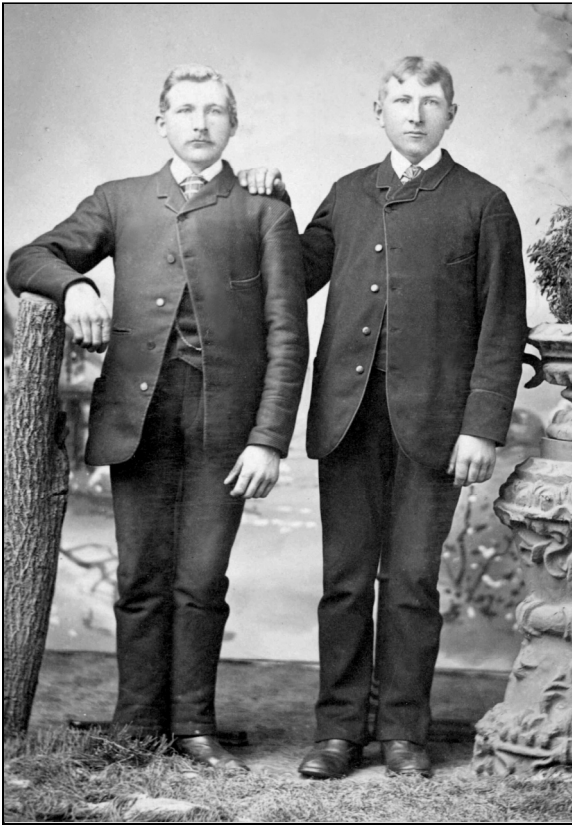

John Reinhold was born Johan Fredrik Enqvist on October 2, 1859 in Vimmerby parish, Kalmar County, Sweden.¹²⁴ He was baptized in Sweden.¹²⁵ Johanna Reinhold was 24 when she gave birth. John was nine when he came to America.¹²⁶ On October 18, 1880, he became a naturalized citizen at the Bureau County Courthouse in Princeton, Illinois.¹²⁷ The name on his immigration petition is John F. Reinhold.¹²⁸

John Reinhold lived in Rock Island from at least 1885 to 1888.¹²⁹ He is listed in the March 1, 1885 Bunn, Philippi & Wilson's Directory of Rock Island, Moline, South Rock Island and Milan as a laborer.¹³⁰ His residence is listed as 2706 Sixth Ave.¹³¹

In about 1890, when John Reinhold was about 30 years old, he moved to Greeley, Weld County, Colorado.¹³² He probably moved to Greeley for health reasons.¹³³ Evelyn (Reinhold) Peterson explained that John had asthma.¹³⁴ She said, when John left for Colorado, he took a letter of recommendation with him written by Mr. Sapp, President of the Wyand Bank. She said the letter explained that John Reinhold was a man of good character and was moving to Colorado for health reasons. She explained that she could no longer remember where the letter was.

According to Evelyn, John Reinhold and his sister, Anna Marie, got along quite well. Both were the mischievous sort, according to Evelyn. Evelyn went on to say that John's father would make John

read the Bible as punishment for inappropriate behavior.

Reinhold as from the testimony of Frederick Reinhold and Gustav Burson who are known to be competent witnesses, that the said applicant arrived in the United States a minor under the age of twenty-one years, has resided within the limits and under the jurisdiction of the United States, for and during the full term of five years, including the three years previous to his arrival at the age of twenty-one years, and one year within the State of Illinois; and having declared on oath, and given to the satisfaction of the Court that for two years next preceding his application it has been bona fide his intention to become a citizen of the United States; and that during said term of five years, he has sustained a good moral character, and appeared to be attached to the principles contained in the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order, well-being and happiness of the same; and the said applicant having now here filed his declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States, according to the provisions of the several Acts of Congress heretofore passed on that subject; and he having now here in open Court taken and subscribed the oath required by those laws, to support the Constitution of the United States, and to renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and more particularly all allegiance which he may in anywise owe to the Kingdom of Sweden whereof he was heretofore a subject.

It is thereupon Considered, Ordered and Adjudged by the Court, That the said John F. Reinhold be admitted to all and singular the rights, privileges and immunities of a naturalized citizen of the United States, and that the same be certified by the Clerk of this Court, under the Seal of said Court, accordingly.

Evelyn recalled her father, John Reinhold, telling her that he lived in Iowa with the Charles Reinhold family for several years, but she does not recall how many years. Although, Evelyn recalled her father telling her that he worked for Charles for about ten years when Charles' children were very young. She also recalled her father telling her that Charles' children were quit small and that John enjoyed playing with them while Charles was working. She recalled John saying that "Hilma would eat sand like it was sugar" and the children thought John Reinhold was fun to play with. On the other hand, she said, Charles Reinhold did not have time for such nonsense.

It appears that John must have worked for Charles from about 1879-1889, although the 1880 Census for Bureau County indicates that John was a 19 year old farmer living with his parents and 1880 Censuses indicates that Charles had one laborer working for him.¹³⁶ John apparently also lived and worked in Rock Island, Illinois while he was working for his brother. John was living in Rock Island, Illinois from at least 1885 through 1888.¹³⁷ In 1890, when John was about 30 years old, he took up farming in Greeley, Colorado.¹³⁸

John Reinhold married Lena Johnson in Wyandot on March 16, 1898.¹³⁹ He would have been 38 years old on his next birthday and she would have been 40 or 42 based on the information shown on their marriage license.¹⁴⁰ Lena was born in either 1856 or 1858.¹⁴¹ Their marriage license notes that Peter Anderson and C. A. Johnson were witnesses.¹⁴² John lived in Colorado about ten years as a bachelor prior to marrying Lena.¹⁴³

After their marriage, John and Lena Reinhold returned to Greeley.¹⁴⁴ By 1908, John purchased his first ten acres in Greeley and built a barn on the property.¹⁴⁵ Then in 1909, John built a house on the property.¹⁴⁶ For 50 years, John Reinhold lived on his farm on east sixteenth street in Greeley, Weld County, Colorado.¹⁴⁷ He was a pig farmer,¹⁴⁸ and truck gardener who sold watermelon, strawberries, butter and eggs.¹⁴⁹ He also had a large cherry orchard.¹⁵⁰ John's house was still standing and in good shape as of August 2001.¹⁵¹

On July 5, 2001, Evelyn took Tanya Tan and me to see John and Lena Reinhold's house in Greeley, Colorado. Their house is on the same street as Frederick and Johanna Reinhold's house, and Oscar and Charlotte Broman's house, except John and Lena's house is in the country while the other houses are in the city.

Evelyn explained that John only farmed with horses and he only farmed up to about 1912. Finally, he only raised hay, and only with horses. John had nothing mechanical on his farm according to Evelyn.

Evelyn said, John and Lena Reinhold had a car quite early, about 1913-1914. She further explained that someone stole their car even though John tried to disable the car so it could not be stolen.

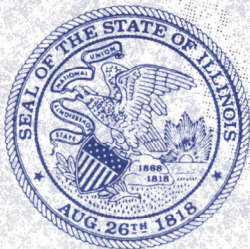

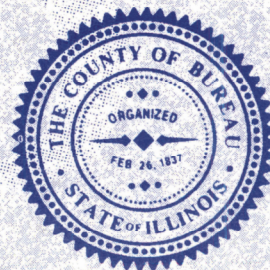

John and Lena Reinhold adopted Evelyn from a state orphanage on May 25, 1912.¹⁵² John was 52 years old, and Lena was 54 or 56. They wanted a four-year old girl and Evelyn was 4 years old on May 26, 1912.¹⁵³ Evelyn was their only child and she eventually married Carl Peterson.¹⁵⁴ They had two boys, Leslie and Glen.¹⁵⁵

Evelyn said that her and her siblings were placed in an orphanage because of neglect due to poverty. According to Evelyn, her biological father was away trying to earn money to support his family, and her biological mother was taking care of the children. According to Evelyn, her biological mother could not afford to take care of the children, so Evelyn's grandmother urged the State to put the children in an orphanage. The State obliged. One day, the State authorities arrived at Evelyn's house. They picked up the children and put them on a train for Denver where the orphanage was located. Evelyn said she was extremely lucky in that she only spent about four weeks in the orphanage. She explained that her brother and four sisters were never adopted. She said her biological mother and father were eventually divorced because of the children being placed in the orphanage.

Evelyn (Reinhold) Peterson explained that many years later, she wanted to find out who her original family was. However, obtaining adoption records could not be done without a court order. Once again, Evelyn was quite lucky. She had gone to school with the Judge and he could not see what harm would be done by allowing Evelyn to view her adoption records. Evelyn knew her birth name was Allen, and she learned that her biological parent's names were Ora Valet and Neva Allen. Evelyn's full birth name was Valletta Allen. Many, many years later, Evelyn said she met with her four sisters and by then, her brother had passed away. Despite having grown-up in the orphanage, Evelyn said, she believes her brother and sisters had a better life than they would have had if they would have been left at home. She believes this, she said, because the area they would have grown up in was poverty stricken then, and even today.

Evelyn said that John Reinhold wanted a child. He thought a house was not a home without children, so he pushed hard to adopt Evelyn. At the time, Lena was not opposed to having a child, she said. Lena just had her hands full of work with her bachelor brother and their mother. Lena's bachelor brother brought their mother from Chicago to live with John and Lena in 1900, according to Evelyn.

Evelyn explained that Lena and John Reinhold took care of their nephew, Paul Broman, when Charlotte (Reinhold) Broman was feeling ill – she had a miscarriage. John and Lena enjoyed Paul despite his rambunctious ways. John and Lena also took care of a neighbor's daughter when the entire family had typhoid fever, except the girl. According to Evelyn, John liked little girls.

Evelyn said John Reinhold took a special interest in making sure that Evelyn got to school during the entire time she went through grade school, high school and two years of college. Evelyn eventually received a teaching certificate. Evelyn said she never ever heard John complain, and she emphasized, "That said a lot about her father." Then Evelyn went on to explain that John Reinhold had his leg amputated prior to getting married. She said John twisted his ankle, and instead of letting his ankle heal, John continued to work in the fields with the sprained, or broken ankle. In any case, the result was that his ankle and leg became infected with gangrene and both had to be amputated.

A doctor in Greeley amputated John Reinhold's leg in the doctor's office, according to Evelyn. John had a very difficult time finding a wooden leg or prostheses. John checked various places including Chicago, but to no avail. The muscle tissue on John's leg changed / shrunk as John grew older, so John had to fabricate special stockings out of undershirts to help fit his leg to his prostheses.

Still, despite his handicap, John never ever complained about taking Evelyn to school. John Reinhold had to get up early to complete his chores before leaving for school. Evelyn said she had to be in school by eight a.m. John had to feed a pig or two. He had to milk a cow, and there were other chores which he had to hurry and complete before leaving. Further, getting up early to complete the chores, and the chores themselves had to have become more difficult as John grew older, but still, according to Evelyn, John never complained.

John Reinhold did not get much education. However, he was quite intelligent according to Evelyn. She explained how she was amazed at John's ability to calculate the amount of wallpaper necessary to cover a wall, or his ability to calculate how much hay was in a haystack. Evelyn further explained that when John was young, about ten or so, there was a greater need for a ten year old boy to be out pulling weeds, etc. than there was for him to be in school. She explained that her father was better than her in many areas requiring intellectual skills, and she had two years of college.

Evelyn recalled a trip to Iowa that her family took in the summer of 1919. They went to visit John's family. John and his family stopped at Charles Reinhold's home in Iowa. At the time, William Theodore was living with Charles and Carrie. He had only recently left the military and was not married. Anyway, Theodore had a Model A Ford and he drove John Reinhold and his family around site seeing and visiting. Theodore drove John and his family out to Carl Oscar Reinhold's farm for a visit. Frank Reinhold and his family also stopped by. Evelyn and Carrie Lucille (Reinhold) Kerns recall the visit, and recall talking to each other. Both told of Billy (William) Reinhold being very bashful. They said Billy went and hid in an orchard or grove of trees all day, so he did not have to visit with the guests. Evelyn was about 11, Carrie Lucille was about 5, Carl Oliver Reinhold was about 2 and Hazel (Reinhold) Moore was about 1 year old. Billy Reinhold was 3 years old.

The 1920 Census identified John F. Reinhold, age 60, his wife, Lena, age 60 and their daughter, Evelyn, age 11.¹⁵⁶ The Census shows that John and Lena owned their home, and everyone in the family could read and write English.¹⁵⁷ The Census shows that Lena was born in Sweden, immigrated to the United States in 1868 and was naturalized in 1880,¹⁵⁸ the same year as John.

Lena Reinhold died in Greeley, Weld County, Colorado on November 17, 1937 at the age of 80.¹⁵⁹ Linn Grove Cemetery Record of Interment, Permit No. 8606 indicates that she died at the age of 81 of lobar pneumonia.¹⁶⁰ Her surviving heirs were her husband, John, and their adopted daughter, Evelyn, age 25.¹⁶¹ Lena is buried in Linn Grove Cemetery, Block 2, Lot 42, Space 5, Greeley, Colorado, next to her husband, John.¹⁶²

Lena Reinhold's estate consisted of promissory notes, corporate stock and cash.¹⁶³ Her estate totaled an estimated \$9,000.¹⁶⁴ Lena bequeathed \$1,000 to Evelyn and \$4,000 to her sister, Ida M. Nienhuser.¹⁶⁵ She bequeathed the residue of her estate to her niece, Darlene (Nienhuser) Nash.¹⁶⁶ Lena's husband received nothing.¹⁶⁷ Ida M. Nienhuser and Evelyn were named joint executors of Lena's estate.¹⁶⁸

John F. Reinhold died in Greeley, Weld County, Colorado on March 7, 1940 of apoplexy-hypertension at the age of 80.¹⁶⁹ Evelyn was 28 years old, John is buried in Linn Grove Cemetery, Block 2, Lot 42, Space 4, Greeley, Colorado, next to his wife, Lena.¹⁷⁰ Macys Mortuary handle John's funeral arrangements.¹⁷¹ At the time of his death, John's sole heir was his adopted daughter, Evelyn.¹⁷²

John and Lena Reinhold share one headstone. The stone is simply, but elegant and indicates their names, dates of birth and death, and identifies them as mother and father. Johan and Lena are buried in the same cemetery, block and lot as Frederick, Johanna and Anna Marie Reinhold.¹⁷³

John and Lena Reinhold's house is two story house with a hip roof. The hip roof style is very similar to the style of a hip roof that one sees on barns in Wisconsin. The house has porches on the front and back, which span the entire width of the house. The house also has a bay window on one side. Behind the house are various small out buildings. A large lawn surrounds the house with the driveway located on the very edge of the lot. An irrigation ditch runs between the driveway and the public road.

John and Lena Reinhold were considered well-to-do people.¹⁷⁴ Upon his death, John's estate consisted of farm and city real estate estimated to be worth \$15,400; rent due from the property estimated to be worth \$1,500 and personal property consisting of promissory notes, corporate stock, cash and bank credits estimated to be worth \$24,000.¹⁷⁵

John Reinhold bequeathed \$700 to each of the following named nephews and nieces with the residual of his estate going to his adopted daughter, Evelyn.¹⁷⁶ After taxes, the beneficiaries of John's estate received the following:¹⁷⁷

Evelyn recalled that Carl Oscar Reinhold was extremely appreciative of the fact that he received \$700 from John Reinhold's estate. According to Evelyn, Carl Oscar wrote her a thank you letter explaining his appreciation and noting that the money arrived, "At just the right time."

The total estate taxes paid on John Reinhold's estate, including miscellaneous fees and interest was \$687.38. Francis F. Broman and Carl R. Peterson were joint executors of John's estate.¹⁷⁹

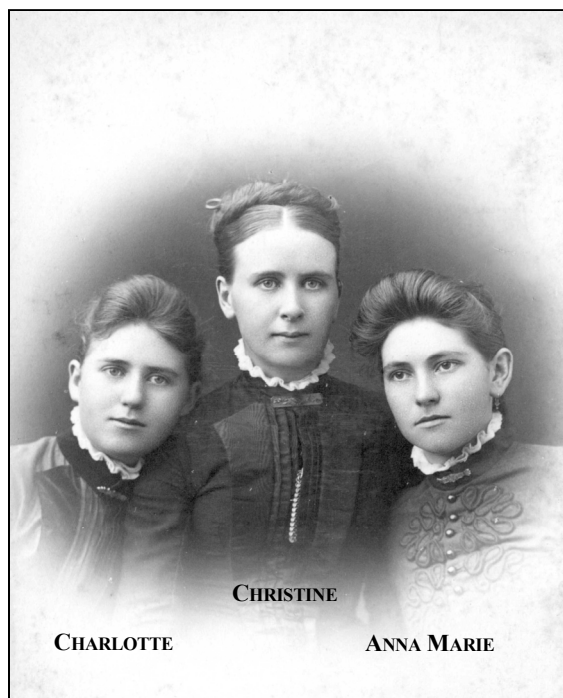

Christine Sophia Enqvist

Christine Sophia¹⁸⁰ Reinhold was born Christina Sophia Enqvist on January 12, 1863 in Rumskulla parish, Kalmar County, Sweden.¹⁸¹ She came to the United States with her parents in 1869 at the age of 6.¹⁸² Christian was confirmed in 1879 at the Wyanet Lutheran Church.¹⁸³ She married John A. Freeman on June 16, 1884 in the City of Wyanet, Bureau County, Illinois.¹⁸⁴ John and Christine Freeman's marriage license notes that John Freeman was born in Hongsvahla, Sweden. His father was Johannes Svgurson Freeman and his mother was Johanna Anderson.¹⁸⁵ At the time they were married, John, a merchant in Moline, Illinois was 32 and Christine was 21.¹⁸⁶ Witnesses to the marriage were F. Reinhold and J. Jespersen.¹⁸⁷ The minister was S. A. Sandahl.¹⁸⁸

Not much is known about Christine and John Freeman. According to Evelyn, Christine (Reinhold) Freeman did not get along too well with the family, and maybe that is why not much is known of her. In any case, John was supposed to have moved to Minnesota to become a minister.¹⁸⁹ Evelyn remembered that John Freeman later studied for the Lutheran ministry in Minnesota. She also remembered that when John Freeman visited in Greeley, he planted Cottonwood trees along the driveway leading to John Reinhold's home and by the barn. The current own of John and Lena Reinhold's property explained that all the Cottonwood trees that John Freeman planted had to be cut down to make way for an irrigation channel, which virtually abuts the property's driveway.¹⁹⁰ The current owner went on to explain that the authorities in charge of the irrigation ditch were not too happy about having to cut down the trees and remove all the roots so the irrigation ditch could be installed.¹⁹¹

From Charles Enquist's Proof of Heirship, one can determine that Christine (Reinhold) Freeman probably died in 1897 at the age of 34 and she had no children.¹⁹² On the June 8, 1900 and 1910 Censuses, Frederick and Johanna indicated that of their seven children only four were living.¹⁹³ Christine had to have died prior to June 8, 1900.

According to Evelyn, Christine (Reinhold) Freeman probably died from food poison contracted from food she ate on a train trip. Evelyn said, her parents always thought that John Freeman made the sack lunch, which Christine ate on the trip, and that Christine died of food poisoning from the food in that sack lunch. This statement cannot be true if John preceded Christina in death or Charles Reinhold's testimony is incorrect.¹⁹⁴ Evelyn said, in those day it was quite common to get sick or die from food poisoning since there was no refrigeration. No documents have been discovered to support Evelyn's statement, not even an obituary for Christine has been located. No information has been found regarding John Freeman. It is not known why or when John Freeman died, except that John died prior to Christine's death according to Charles Enquist's Proof of Heirship.¹⁹⁵ It would seem that Charles should have testified correctly given the event should have been known to him and Frederick and Johanna should have indicated the correct information on the June 8, 1900 and 1910 Censuses, that of their seven children only four were living, given the events should have been known to them, too.

It is also not known where Christine or John Freeman are buried or where they died. Bev Francque checked all the Cemetery Readings for Moline and Rock Island, Illinois and did not find Christine or John Freeman in any of them.¹⁹⁶ They were not in the obituary files either.¹⁹⁷ Bev Francque only found one reference to John Freeman at the First Lutheran Church and that was a letter from Mr. J.A. Freeman. The letter is written in Swedish and according to Bev, the essence of the letter is that Mr. J.A. Freeman requested membership in the Church, and after serious discussion of Freeman, they decided to table the matter.¹⁹⁸ John Freeman was not listed as a member of the First Lutheran Church.¹⁹⁹

According to a Librarian/Archivist at the Goodhue County Historical Society, Red Wing, Minnesota, John and Christine Freeman do not appear in the Dalby database of burial records, so it is unlikely that they are buried in Red Wing or surrounding counties. The Librarian went on to say, that the Dalby database covers all of Goodhue County plus some of the surrounding counties of Minnesota, so she doubted that any further searches for the Freemans in that area would turn up anything.

Johanna Charlotta Enqvist

Charlotte Reinhold was born Johanna Charlotta Enqvist on February 3, 1868 in Södra Vi parish, Kalmar County, Sweden.²⁰⁰ Johanna Reinhold was 34 when she gave birth. The Wyanet Lutheran Church registry indicates Charlotte was confirmed in the Wyanet Lutheran Church on April 29, 1883.²⁰¹ Charlotte was also known as Lottie. She came to America with her parents when she was one year old.²⁰² In the 1880 Census for Concord Township, Bureau County, Illinois, she is recorded as age 12 and a student.²⁰³

In 1891, Charlotte Reinhold is listed in Stone's Moline City Directory for 1891.²⁰⁴ Her occupation is listed as teacher and her address is listed as 2531 Fifth Ave., Rock Island, Illinois.²⁰⁵ Presumably, Charlotte was living with Frederick and Johanna in Rock Island, since in 1891, Frederick's address was also listed as 2531 Fifth Ave., Rock Island, Illinois.²⁰⁶

Charlotte Reinhold was a school teacher and at one time, she taught in Rockford, Illinois.²⁰⁷ On May 12, 1898, Charlotte wrote a lovely letter to her niece, Hilma Reinhold.²⁰⁸ In the letter, Charlotte writes of her fondness for teaching. Charlotte was 30 years old and Hilma was 16.

On August 30, 1900, Charlotte married Oscar Broman in Rock Island, Illinois.²⁰⁹ Their marriage license shows her maiden name as Lottie J. Reynolds.²¹⁰ Their marriage license identified her father as Frederick Reynolds, and her sister, Anna Marie, as Anna Reynolds.²¹¹ Once again, this issue of names probably had to do with the fact that Charlotte thought Reynolds was more stylish than Reinhold.

According to Evelyn, Charlotte Reinhold and Oscar Broman met in Greeley, Colorado. Evelyn said Charlotte and Oscar Broman were raised in the Swedish Lutheran Church, and both were organists at John and Lena Reinhold's church in Greeley, Colorado. Evelyn said, she thinks that Charlotte and Oscar went to

Rock Island, Illinois to get married because that is where Charlotte's parents were living at the time.

Shortly after they married, Charlotte and Oscar Broman left for Michigan where Oscar went to medical school and eventually received his M.D. degree.²¹² According to Evelyn, Oscar Broman was originally from Michigan. Evelyn said, Oscar Broman was an music teach; however, Charlotte paid for her husband's medical training. According to Evelyn, Charlotte had the money, not Oscar. Evelyn explained that Charlotte was a school teacher and that is where she earned the money to put Oscar through medical school.

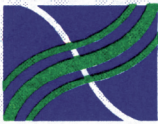

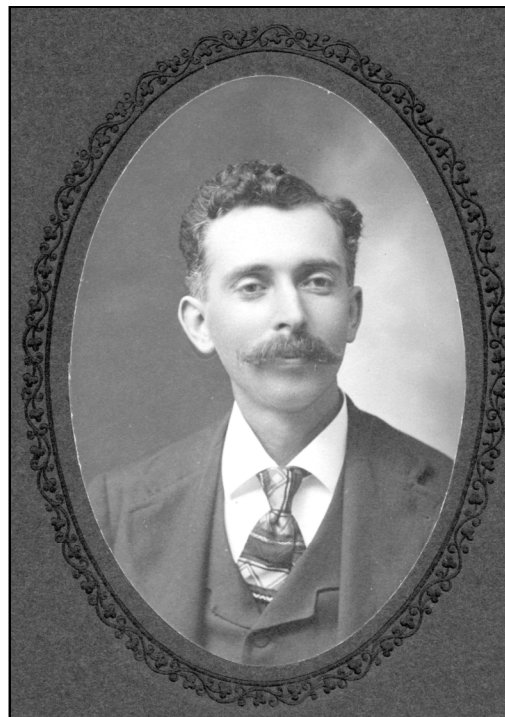

THOUGHT TO BE OSCAR BROMAN
 OSCAR WAS A MEDICAL DOCTOR

Charlotte and Oscar Broman lived in Michigan for three years.²¹³ While in Michigan, Charlotte gave birth to their first child.²¹⁴ Charlotte and Oscar did not return to Rock Island after Oscar finished medical school.²¹⁵ Instead, in 1903, Charlotte and Oscar went to Greeley, Colorado to set up Oscar's practice and probably for health reasons.²¹⁶ Charlotte had tuberculosis.²¹⁷

On July 5, 2001, Evelyn took Tanya Tan and me to see Oscar and Charlotte Broman's house in Greeley, Colorado. Their house is on the same street as Frederick and Johanna Reinhold's house, and John and Lena Reinhold's house. Their house is located one block up the street from Frederick's house, and between Frederick's house and John's house. However, it is several miles between Charlotte's house and John's house.

Oscar and Charlotte Broman's house is very stately. It is a large two story brick house with a balcony on the second floor located over the front porch. The house appears to have a full basement with probably two and a half feet of the basement above ground level. The house appears to need some maintenance work. Supposedly, the house belongs to a university and college students rent space in the house.²¹⁸

A large complex is located across the street from Oscar and Charlotte Broman's house. When Oscar was practicing medicine, the complex was a hospital and Dr. Broman had his practice in his house.²¹⁹ His patient entered through a door on the side of the house.²²⁰ When necessary, Dr. Broman would cross the street to practice medicine at the hospital.²²¹ The hospital complex has been converted into low cost housing.²²² Dr. Broman had a nice location for his medical practice.

Charlotte Broman died at St. Joseph's Hospital in Denver, Colorado²²³ on December 6, 1943 of Cardiac Failure.²²⁴ She was 75 years, 10 months and 3 days old at her death.²²⁵ Charlotte was interned on December 8, 1943 in Block 10, Lot 34, Space 7 of Linn Grove Cemetery, Greeley, Colorado.²²⁶ Her obituary²²⁷ says:

In Greeley, Mrs. Broman was active in the First Presbyterian church, teaching a Sunday school class and holding membership in the Woman's Missionary Society, Aleph Missionary Society, and Division Two. She held numerous offices in those organizations. She was also a member of Social Science Circle and Garden City chapter Order [sic] of Eastern Star.

Dr. Oscar Frances Broman died September 5, 1937.²²⁸ At the time of his death, he was 62 years, 10 months and 25 days.²²⁹ His cause of death was intestinal obstruction, adhesions following an operation for the same.²³⁰ It appears the operation to correct the problem was unsuccessful. Oscar was interned on September 7, 1937 next to his wife, Charlotte, in Block 10, Lot 34, Space 8 of Linn Grove Cemetery, Greeley, Colorado.²³¹

Oscar and Charlotte Broman's children were Francis F. Broman, an employee of the federal civil service commission, Paul H. Broman, an employee of the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph, and Ebba A. C. Broman, a psychiatrist with the Denver Child Welfare Department.²³² There were five Broman grandchildren Russell, Ronald Richard, Betty Ann and Charlotte Jean.²³³

Oscar and Charlotte Broman share one red granite headstone. The stone is large. Its design is simple, but elegant and indicates their names, dates of birth and death, although Charlotte's date of death has not been inscribed on the stone. Oscar and Charlotte Broman are buried in the same cemetery as Frederick, Johanna and Anna Marie Reinhold, and John and Lena Reinhold.²³⁴

Mrs. O. F. Broman Dies in Denver

Mrs. Charlotte J. Broman, 75, of 2550 Glencoe street, Denver, wife of the late Dr. O. F. Broman, prominent Greeley physician and surgeon, died at St. Joseph's hospital early Monday morning.

In August Mrs. Broman fell and fractured her pelvic girdle. It had healed nicely and she was able to be up and out again. Last Tuesday she went to St. Joseph's hospital for laboratory tests, slipped on a step and fell, breaking her hip. She failed to fully following an operation to set the bone Saturday.

She held numerous offices in those organizations. She was also a member of Social Science Circle and Garden City chapter, Order of Eastern Star.

Survivors include three children, Paul H. Broman, of Denver, employed by the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph company; Francis F. Broman of Denver, an employee of the federal civil service commission; and Ebba A. C. Broman, a psychiatrist with the child welfare department of the city of Denver. There are five grandchildren, Russell, Ronald and Richard Broman and Betty Ann and Charlotte Jean Broman, all of Denver.

Two funeral services are planned for Wednesday. One will be held from the Olinger mortuary, Sixteenth and Speer, at 11 o'clock Wednesday morning. The second will be from Macy's drawing room, at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, with interment at Linn Grove.

Anna Marie Reinhold

Anna Marie Reinhold was born Anna Marie Reinhold in Princeton, Illinois on August 9, 1873, and baptized September 21, 1873 in Princeton, Illinois.²³⁶ Johanna Reinhold was 39 when she gave birth. The Wyand Lutheran Church registry indicates that Anna Marie was baptized in Princeton on September 21, 1873, but confirmed at the Wyand Lutheran Church on July 8, 1888.²³⁷

Anna Marie Reinhold was a graduate of the Moline, Illinois High School and the State Normal School.²³⁸ After teaching a year in Illinois, she went to Colorado to recuperate from her failing health.²³⁹ She taught in Kersey, Colorado for years, at LaGrange one year, and then returned to Illinois to teach, apparently recovered.²⁴⁰ Anna Marie again returned to Colorado three years before she died.²⁴¹

Anna Marie Reinhold was listed in the Rock Island City and Moline City Directories in 1909.²⁴² In the Moline City Directory, Anna Marie is listed as Reynolds, Anna M., Miss.²⁴³ Her occupation in both Directories is listed as teacher,²⁴⁴ and the Moline Directory indicates she is working at Garfield School.²⁴⁵ In the Rock Island Directory, she is listed as living with her parents, Frederick and Johanna C.²⁴⁶ Their address is 4412 7th Ave.,²⁴⁷ while the Moline Directory indicates that she boarded in Rock Island.²⁴⁸

Frederick, Johanna and Anna Marie appear on the 1910 Census for Rock Island Township, Rock Island County, Illinois.²⁴⁹ The Census identifies Frederick, Johanna and Ann Marie living together.²⁵⁰ Frederick is identified as Fred and Anna Marie is identified as Annie.²⁵¹ The family name is written as Rhinhold. Frederick was 82 years old, Johanna was 75 and Anna Marie was 35.²⁵² Anna Marie's occupation is listed as school teacher, working in a public school and she was single.²⁵³ The Census indicates that Anna Marie had 12 years of formal education and was born in Illinois.²⁵⁴

In 1910, Frederick, Johanna and Anna Marie all moved to Greeley, Colorado because of Anna Marie's health.²⁵⁵ Apparently, Anna Marie's health worsened in 1910 and her parents wanted to help their daughter recover from tuberculosis.²⁵⁶

Anna Marie Reinhold died on February 2, 1912 of pulmonary tuberculosis in Greeley, Colorado.²⁵⁷ Anna Marie was 38 years, 5 months and 23 days old.²⁵⁸ She died the same year that her father and mother died.²⁵⁹ All three died within about three weeks of each other.²⁶⁰ She never married and had no children.²⁶¹ Anna Marie is buried in Linn Grove Cemetery, Block 2, Lot 42, Space 1, Greeley, Colorado.²⁶² The Greeley Daily Tribune said in Anna's obituary that Anna, "Was a young lady of beautiful character who was loved by all who knew her."²⁶³
