

Martin Van Laarhoven was born Crijfogonus Ambrosius Martinus Van Laarhoven on December 7, 1895 in Oostelbeers, Nood-Brabant, Holland, although his death certificate says Best, Holland. His parents were Cornelius Van Laarhoven, a farmer, age 31, living in Oostelbeers and Jacoba Wouters, his wife, a farmer, living in Oostelbeers. He went by the name Martin Van Laarhoven after immigrating to the United States.

Martin's death certificate indicates his mother's name was spelled Jacoba Walters and his father's was spelled Cornelius Van Laarhoven. Cornelius Van Laarhoven prepared a remembrance card for his wife, Jacoba, when she died. Her remembrance card was written in English and Dutch. On both cards, Martin's parents' names are spelled Jacoba Wouters, wife of Cornelius Van Laarhoven. Further, there is an abundance of other evidence that indicating that Jacoba's last name was Wouters.



MARTIN VAN LAARHOVEN AND LUDMILLA ROTHAMER'S WEDDING PICTURE, MARRIED OCTOBER 12, 1920.

Martin Van Laarhoven and Ludmilla Rothamer were married October 12, 1920⁸ at the Holy Rosary Catholic Church in Medford, Wisconsin, although Martin's obituary says October 12, 1920 while Ludmilla's obituary says October 12, 1921⁹ Rev. G. Reuter signed their marriage certificate, and Ludmilla's brother and sister, David and Clara Rothamer were witnesses to their marriage. The marriage certificate indicates that Martin's occupation was farming and Ludmilla's was housewife. When they married, Martin was 24 and Ludmilla was 21. Their marriage was the first for both. After their marriage, they farmed in the Town of Little Black, Taylor County, Wisconsin. According to Josephine (Van Laarhoven) Reinhold, Martin Van Laarhoven met Ludmilla Rothamer when he rode his

According to Josephine (Van Laarhoven) Reinhold, Martin Van Laarhoven met Ludmilla Rothamer when he rode his horse over to George and Ludmilla Rothamer's place to buy some potatoes. Cornelius Van Laarhoven's farm shared a line fence with and abutted George Rothamer's farm. ¹⁶ The Van Laarhoven family and the Rothamer family were neighbors. Apparently, Rothamers were growing potatoes, and in the process of buying potatoes, Martin met George's daughter, Ludmilla, who he eventually married. ¹⁷ According to Josephine Reinhold, Martin struck quite an image while riding his horse, and Ludmilla was just taken by him.





1920 PLAT MAP, LITTLE BLACK TOWNSHIP, TAYLOR COUNTY, WISCONSIN







LUDMILLA (ROTHAMER) VAN LAARHOVEN'S BAPTISMAL CERTIFICATE



Ludmilla (Rothamer) Van Laarhoven was born Ludmilla Rothamer on January 12, 1899 in Mellen, Ashland County, Wisconsin and baptized on January 22, 1899 at Holy Rosary Church in Mellen. Her sponsors were Francis Rothammer and Anna Derdowski. Her parents were George Rothamer and Ludmilla (Kummer) Rothamer. Rothamer.

Martin and Ludmilla (Rothamer) Van Laarhoven had seven children. William, their first child, was born July 8, 1921 in Little Black, Wisconsin and died November 30, 1999 in City of Punta Gorda, Charlotte County, Florida.²¹ Vernon, their second child, was born July 28, 1922 and died January 26, 1923 of broncho pneumonia.²² Martina Stella was born January 27, 1924 and died December 6, 1928.²³ Her cause of death was 3rd degree burns over almost her entire body.²⁴ She lived about four hours after being burned.²⁵

Josephine Mary was born April 9, 1925 with no deformities.²⁸ She was the 4th child in order of births and was legitimate.²⁹ She was baptized Josephine Marie on April 12, 1925. When Josephine was born, her parents had three living children and one child had died.³⁰ At the time of her birth, Josephine's father, Martin, was a farmer and her mother was a housewife.³¹ La Verne Jacoba was born August 1, 1927 and died December 6, 1928.³² Her cause of death was 3rd degree burns over large areas of her head, body and extremities.³³ She lived 2-3 hours after being burned.³⁴ La Verne Mary was born October 30, 1929.³⁵ Vernon Karl was born July 19, 1932.³⁶ La Verne Mary and Vernon Karl were named after their brother and sister who died prior to La Verne Mary and Vernon Karl's birth.³⁷ All the children were born in the Town of Little Black, Taylor County Wisconsin.³⁸ Martina Stella, La Verne Jacoba, and Vernon are all buried in the Catholic Cemetery, Medford, Wisconsin next to their parents.³⁹



Martina, La Vern Jacoba and Josephine Mary Van Laarhoven were burned in a house fire on December 6, 1928.⁴⁰ Their father's birthday was the next day, December 7.⁴¹ Josephine wrote about the incident many years later saying,⁴²

When the fire took place, Willie was seven, Martina four (about to turn five), I was three and LaVerne Jacoba was sixteen months. It was a cold night and we three girls were playing with the Christmas catalogs. Father built shelves high up in the corners of the kitchen to hold kerosene lamps so they were out of our way and to prevent us children from playing with fire. On this fateful night my parents decided to leave us girls play with the catalogs, but warned us not to tear the pages out. With all safety factors in mind, my parents and Willie went to the barn to do the chores. Soon the catalogs were torn and paper was laying all over the congoleum floor. A wood burning stove was burning brightly in the kitchen. We decided to pick up the papers and throw them in the kitchen stove through its side door. A draft blew some of the burning paper back out when the door was opened and onto the floor catching the other paper on fire. Congoleum was a floor covering very much like tar paper, but with a shiny covering to make it easy to clean. It took little time for this floor covering to melt and burst into flames, giving off fumes and smoke. Little LaVerne Jacoba caught on fire while being overcome with smoke. Martina tried to drag her little sister out of the flames, but Martina caught on fire. I had my arms burned, but thought I had better run to the barn to tell our parents. I heard Martina scream. Turning around, I saw her standing on the porch completely engulfed in flames. Father opened the barn door about this time as he had done frequently before. Seeing the flames and the children, he ran to the house and quickly put out the flames, kicking LaVerne Jacoba in the process. My parents did not own a car so my father ran up the hill to Paul Bach's home to get their car. Mother wrapped us in blankets and rushed us to the hospital. At the hospital LaVerne Jacoba was pronounced dead on arrival from smoke inhalation. Martina was taken to the emergency room. She was burned over 100 percent of her body. My arms were burned and I was put in a crib in the children's ward. Martina was asked what happened and who put the paper in the stove. She said, "Josephine did." She was extremely dehydrated and asking for water. Later she died. I was not seriously burned, but little did I know that I would pay dearly for the deaths of my sisters and many times I questioned, Lord, why was I allowed to live while my beautiful sisters were allowed to die? I stayed in the hospital until the funeral was over. Over the years I was told by many people, including my parents, that since my sisters were burned so severely, they were placed in white caskets like little angels with only cotton fluffed around them. I was told they looked like little angels and little angels they were.

Children Burn

Three children of Martin Van Laarhoven, a Medford (Wis.) farmer, were severely burned late Thursday and two of them died within a few hours at the Medford hospital. The clothing of the children caught fire when they fed leaves of a catalogue into the side draft of the kitchen stove while the parents were in the barn. Girl Loses Life Trying to Rescue Baby Brother: Their Child Expected to Live

BY SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT OF THE JOURNAL Medford, Wis .- Two children died at the hospital here and another is in serious condition as the result of burns suffered when their clothing caught fire from an open side draft stove in the kitchen of their farm

The dead child en are Martina. 5. and Laverne, 1, and the one believed to have a chance to live is Josephine, 3. They are children of Martin Van Laarhoven, who has a farm two miles south of Medford.

Stuck Paper in Stove

Mr. and Mrs. Van Laarhoven and a son, William, 7, were in the barn Thursday night doing chores. The other three children were playing with a catalogue in the kitchen. It is believed that the fire started when they fed leaves from the catalogue into the side draft of the stove.

The clothing of the children and garments hanging from hooks on the wall caught fire. The screaming youngsters ran out on the back porch and attracted the attention of their parents. Mr. Van Laarhov-en was burned about the arms and hands in putting out the flames.

The children were brought to the hospital here at once. Little coulc be done for Laverne. His body was charred in places and his face abou his mouth indicated that he ha breathed in the flames. He di about 9 p. m.

Tried to Save Brother

Martina lived until about 1 a. m. Friday. She gave her life in an effort to save her little brother. She was burned on the arms and face and body in her efforts to beat out Laverne's burning garments and her clothing caught fire from his, severely burning the upper part of her

Josephine's burns were largely on the arms and upper body.

Confusion at the Van Laarhoven home was increased when the dense smoke quenched the lights in kerosene lamps. The fire was extinguished after a clothes cabinet and part of the floor of the kitchen had burned.

Two Children Burned To Death In Fire At Little Black

Third Child Burned Badly Will Recover

A terrible tragedy occurred at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Martin Van Laarhoven, Little Black, Thursday evening, when the clothing of three of their children caught fire while playing around the kitchen stove, two of the children being so severely burned that they died a few hours later.

Mr. and Mrs. Van Laarhoven and their oldest child, William, age 7, had gone to the barn to do the evening chores leaving the three younger children in the house, they amusing themselves by looking thru a catalogue picking out the things they wanted for Christmas, the baby Laverne, 16 months old, sitting on the floor in front of the stove and Josephine, age 3, and Martina, age 5, grouped around her.

The children's account of the accident is as follows: After looking thru the catalogue for some time they started tearing out the leaves, sicking them thru the druft opening in the front of the stove. One of the burning pieces of paper must have fallen near the baby setting fire to the other paper lying on the floor and the child's clothing and in an attempt to save her, the clathing of both the other children caught fire. The two older girls ran screaming from the house and were standing on the back porch, Martina one mass of flames, when their father came out of the barn. He ran to the children and tore the burning clothing from Martina's body: Josephine being successful in subduing the fire in her own clothing without assistance.

Entering the smoked filled kitchen, he found the baby, terribly burned, lying on the floor and some garments which were hanging near the stove on fire. Quickly extinquishing the flames, he ran to the home of a neighbor, Paul Bach, who with his automobile brot Mr. and Mrs. Van Laarhoven

and the three children to the Medford Clinic. The baby passed away about 10 o'clock the same evening and two hours later little Martina also passed away.

Tho Josephine was badly burned about the body, her injuries are not so serious but that she will recover. Mr. Van Laarhoven was also badly burned in extinguishing the fire, particularly on the right hand.

The double funeral for the two little children was held at the Catholic

church, this city, Monday morning, Rev. Fr. Reuter officiating, with interment in the Catholic cemetery. The eight little girls who acted as pall bearers were Dorothy, Marcella and Harriet Rothammer, Margaret, Geraldine and Kathryn Pernsteiner, Marie Brehm and Eleanor Long.

The sympathy of this entire community goes out to the bereaved parents. They are a hard working young couple who were striving, diligently, to make a happy home for their four children. They bought their 80 acre farm eight years ago from Mr. Van Laarhoven's father, Cornelius Van Laarhoven, who now lives in Kaukauna. Since the accident, neighbors have been assisting Mr. Van Laarhoven with the farm work and Anna Poehnelt has been helping around the house.

Out of town relatives here for the funeral were:

Mr. and Mrs. Henry Van Laarhoven and family, Kimberly; Mr. and Mrs. Tony Van Laarhoven, Madison, and Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Van Laarhoven, Iron Mountain, Mich.

Mr. Van Laarhoven's parents from Kaukauna, were unable to be here because of the critical illness of his mother.

Van Laarhoven Girl Recovers

Josephine Van Laarhoven, three years old, who was the least burned of the three children in the terrible burning accident at Little Black Thursday night, is recovering satisfactorily. She was able to leave the hospital for her home Monday.

When the clothing of the three children started to burn Josephine rushed screaming to the back porch. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Martin Van Laarhoven, who were in the barn doing their chores, heard her and came running to meet her. The flames had only started to burn her arms, so Mr. Van Laarhoven was able to extinguish them before they made much further progress.

The other two girls were beyond help, but the parents made stren-uous efforts to save them. Putting out the flames on their clothing, they got the children to the hospital at Medford as quickly as possible, with the help of their neighbor, Paul

Laverne, the sixteen-months-old baby girl, died at the hospital at about nine that night, a little over two hours after the accident. Martina, the five-year-old daughter, lived until about 12:30.

Martina, Josephine, and Laverne had been left in the house at the Van Laarhoven home, a mile west of Little Black, while the parents, accompanied by the seven-year-old son William, went to the barn to do the evening chores. Mr. Van Laar-hoven had made a trip to the house just a few minutes before the acci-

The children were playing on the kitchen floor in front of the range, which had a sliding draft and also an end opening for fuel. They had been playing with catalogs and newspapers. It is supposed that either they put pieces of paper into the stove and pulled them out when burning or a spark from the wood fire flew out and set fire to the papers. Their clothing was soon in flames.

Martina, with her clothes flaming, rushed out of the house to the back porch, where her father ran to her help. He was able to put out the flames on her clothing but they had already done the damage. Martina was very badly burned, there being scarcely any skin left except on her

Mr. Van Laarhoven fuen rusmed into the house, looking for the baby, Laverne, and attempting to prevent the house from burning. The dense smoke from burning clothing and paper had put out the kerosene lamp, so it was impossible to see anything in the kitchen. The floor was starting to burn and clothing hanging on the wall was burning. Mr. Van Laarhoven, while pulling the clothing down from the wall, struck his foot against the baby and, reaching down in the blinding smoke, found her on the floor in a bunch of burning paper and burning clothing. The baby was badly burned and from the appearance of its face and mouth it had breathed in flames.

The double funeral of the Laar-hoven girls took place Monday morning, with services at the Holy Rosary church in Medford, con-ducted by Rev. Fr. Reuter. Burial was in Evergreen cemetery. The pall bearers were eight girls of the Van Laarhoven neighborhood: Dorothy. Marcella and Harriett Rothamer, Margaret, Geraldine, and Katherine Pernsteiner, Marie Brehm, and Eleanor Long.

Both children were born on the farm where they lost their lives. Laverne was 16 months old, having been born August 1, 1927, and Martina was almost five, having been born January 27, 1924. The surviving children are William, aged seven, and Josephine, who three last April.

Among the out-of-town people at the funeral were three of Mr. Van Laarhoven's brothers and their wives: Mr. and Mrs. Ted Van Laarhoven, Iron Mountain, Michigan; Mr. and Mrs. Tony Van Laarhoven, Madison; and Mr. and Mrs. Henry Van Laarhoven, Kimberly. His father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Cornelius Van Laarhoven of Kaukauna, were unable to attend the funeral, as the mother is not expected to live; the other brothers, Johann of Kaukauna, Jack of West DePere, and Pete of Clintonville, also were unable to be present.

The neighbors and other friends of the Van Laarhovens and other people of the community have been very kind to them and the Red Cross and other organizations have been able to be of assistance. Miss Annie Poehnelt has been assisting Mrs. Van Laarhoven at their home since the accident.













It will have a ceiling height of 8 ft. under the present building, and 11 ft. for that portion clear of the build-The front will be of glass and brick, with the former predominating.

It was explained by Van Laar-hoven that the addition would be a separate building, but would connect with the present structure through the use of steel beams.

While his wife, and children ran the farm, Martin developed his implement business.45 Martin purchased a piece of property that included a building in Little Black, **Taylor** County, Wisconsin.⁴⁶ The property was next to Mackoveck's printing shop in Little Black.⁴⁷ Later, Martin purchase a second piece of property located across the street from his first piece, and he moved the building from his first piece of property across the road to the newly purchased property.48 With his second parcel, Martin had a shop and a lot to display his equipment.⁴⁹

Later, after World War II started, Martin sold both pieces of property in the Little Black and moved his implement business, including all his equipment to his farm located in the Little Black Township. Martin's farm was adjacent to the property on which Little Black State Graded School was located. He ran his implement business from his farm until on April 14, 1944 when he purchased property in Medford, Wisconsin on which the Germanin Hall was located. He bought the property from the Medford Council 1744, Knights of Columbus for \$2,500. The Germanin Hall was in the general vicinity of and on the same street as the Medford Court House and Jail. After Martin purchase the property on which the Germanin Hall sat, he ran his implement business out of the Germanin Hall until his death in 1955.

On May 14, 1952, Martin and Ludmilla (Rothamer) Van Laarhoven purchased Ludmilla (Kummer) Rothammer's house in the City of Medford from Ludmilla Van Laarhoven's brother and his wife, David and Hanna Rothamer for \$6,000.⁵⁵ David and Hanna carried Martin and Ludmill's \$2,500 five year mortgage.⁵⁶ David and Hanna inherited the house from David's mother, Ludmilla (Kummer) Rothamer when she died November 30, 1951.⁵⁷

Josephine (Van Laarhoven) Reinhold explained that Martin and Ludmilla (Rothamer) Van Laarhoven planned to move into Ludmilla (Kummer) Rothamer's house in Medford after they purchased it.⁵⁸ But when the Korean War broke out, their son, Vernon Van Laarhoven, was drafted into the military.⁵⁹ He had been operating their farm in the Town of Little Black.⁶⁰ As a result, Martin and Ludmilla's plans changed.⁶¹ Martin lived in the house in Medford for six months after having bought the house and Ludmilla took care of the farm, coming into Medford each Sunday.⁶²

Martin Van Laarhoven died January 17, 1955 in Medford, Wisconsin and is buried in Evergreen Cemetery, Medford, 63 although his death certificate says Martin was buried in the Medford Catholic Cemetery, Medford, Wisconsin.⁶⁴ His death certificate indicates that he was living at 262 Washington Ave., Medford, Taylor County, Wisconsin at the time of his death and he had been living there for six months prior to his death. 65 Martin was 59 years old and married when he died⁶⁶ He died of acute ventricular fibrillation due to myocardial infarct.⁶⁷ A period of 12 hours passed from the onset of the condition causing Martin's death until his death.⁶⁸ LaVerne (Van Laarhoven) Zastrow & Josephine (Van Laarhoven) Reinhold explained that maybe in medical terms, 12 hours passed from the onset of the condition causing his death, but for those present when he died, his death was very sudden, within seconds. His social security number was 390-32-8298.⁶⁹ Mrs. Ludmilla Van Laarhoven provided the information contained in Martin's certificate of death.⁷⁰

Josephine (Van Laarhoven) Reinhold wrote:⁷¹

On Monday morning, January 17, 1955, Father did not feel well so he decided to see Dr. Pieterson. He thought he had the flu. Father walked the short distance from the shop to the chiropractor's office, had his treatment and returned to the shop. Mauritz Eagle, our milkman, hauled the morning milk from his route to the factory and then went to the shop. He enjoyed my father's company. There were other folks there including my brother, Bill. Father was telling a joke when all of a sudden he fell from his chair and died from a massive heart attack. Mauritz Eagle tried CPR. Dr. Meyer and the priest were called. Mother was called from the farm. We lost our father so quickly. It was such a shock! The Red Cross called my brother, Vernon, home again and he stayed several weeks. When the Red Cross called, Vernon was certain one of his babies had died. When the babies were born, Carla weighed in at an ounce or two over two pounds and Charles weighed in a few ounces over three pounds. Vernon was overwhelmed when he was told his father died. Our entire family could not get over the sudden shock. Bill was devastated seeing his father joking one minute and dead the next. Our mother was devastated. Father was always her shining star. They had many difficult times, but forgiveness was always around the corner. Vernon was just home and his father was fine. Then he was gone. For me, I lost a friend I had finally found. LaVerne took it very hard. She felt she had shortened her father's life by leaving the faith he held so dear.

Martin Van Laarhoven's Last Will and Testament dated December 5, 1952 left everything he owned to his wife, Ludmilla.⁷² Specific property identified in Martin's will was the Massey-Harris Agency and business enterprise, the farm located in the Town of Little Black, dwelling house in the City of Medford and various personal property.⁷³ Martin's son, William Van Laarhoven was named as Martin's executor.⁷⁴


