

Charles O. Reinhold Died

Peoples Hospital Sunday

Charles O. Reinhold was born in Calmar, Sweden, Oct. 27, 1853, and passed away at the Peoples hospital in Independence Sunday morning, June 16, 1929, at 8:30 o'clock.

He came from the old country to Illinois with his parents in 1869 at the age of sixteen, and was married to Carrie Anderson Sept. 10, 1879, at Wyanet, Ill. He came to Iowa March 1, 1900, and in the winter of 1908 settled on his farm near Winthrop, moving to Winthrop in 1923, where he has since resided.

His wife preceded him in death Nov. 21, 1927. A son, Frank E., of Quasqueton, passed away Aug. 26, 1922. He leaves to mourn three children—Mrs. Hilma A. Bordwell, of Wilmington, Cal.; Carl Oscar, of Medford, Wis.; and William Theodore, of Winthrop—besides nine grandchildren. There is also one brother, John Reinhold, and a sister, Mrs. Lottie Broman, both of Greeley, Colo.

Funeral services, conducted by Rev. H. W. Arman, of the M. E. church, were held from the Theodore Reinhold home Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Burial was made in Fairview cemetery. The many friends of the family extend sympathy.
