

William Reinhold Funeral Services Held at Winthrop

William Theodore Reinhold, 69, a resident of Winthrop for many years, died at his home in Canon City, Colo., on Saturday, March 31. Death was caused by a coronary occlusion.

The son of Charles and Carrie Reinhold, he was born April 9, 1887, at Wyanett, Ill. He was married to Maude Dennie of Winthrop on June 15, 1921, at Nashua. The Reinholds lived in Winthrop for many years, where Mr. Reinhold worked as carpenter and contractor. They moved to St. George, Utah about four years ago and the past year and a half have lived in Canon City, Colo. Mr. Reinhold was a veteran of World War I.
