

Typical Deadline: Multiple deadlines throughout the year, final around February/March

Why This Fits: One of the largest and oldest indie book awards. Winning an IPPY medal provides significant marketing clout and credibility.

Requirements: Books must be in English and intended for the North American market.

Timely Angles & News Hooks

1. The Geopolitical Chess Match: US vs. China

Pitch media outlets with the angle: 'This new thriller explores the nightmare scenario of direct US-China conflict everyone is worried about.' Use in social media posts connecting the book's plot to recent headlines about Taiwan or trade disputes.

Best Timing: Ongoing, especially during periods of heightened international tension.

2. The Race for Clean Energy: Fusion's Promise and Peril

When news breaks about a real-world fusion energy milestone, create content (blog, video) titled 'Fiction vs. Reality: The Ethical Dilemma of Limitless Energy Explored in 'The Fall Of Kingdoms''. Pitch science and tech bloggers/podcasters.

Best Timing: Opportunistic; tied to science news cycles.

3. Our Fragile Infrastructure: The Real Threat of Cyber & Satellite Warfare

Following any major cyberattack or discussion of space weaponization, pitch security-focused blogs and podcasts. The hook: 'A new novel imagines the day the lights—and satellites—go out for good. How close is this to reality?'

Best Timing: Opportunistic; tied to cybersecurity and defense news.

4. Domestic Radicalization and Political Polarization

Frame Carl Mischler's character arc as a case study in how a law-abiding citizen can be radicalized. This is a powerful angle for op-eds or podcast discussions on political division and its potential consequences.

Best Timing: Evergreen, particularly potent during election cycles.
