

Plan ebook price promotions around key dates relevant to the book's themes. For example, run a sale for International Women's Day (March), Armed Forces Day (May in the US), or NAIDOC Week (July in Australia). This gives you a fresh reason to promote the book long after launch.

■ **Deadline:** Plan quarterly.

5. Collaborate with Other Authors

Find other authors in your niche (especially those from your 'Comparable Titles & Analysis' section) and propose newsletter swaps, social media takeovers, or joint giveaways. This is one of the most effective ways to reach new, highly-qualified readers.

■ **Deadline:** Ongoing, starting Month 3.

Award Submission Strategy

1. Foreword INDIES Book of the Year Awards

Recommended Category: Primary: Thriller & Suspense. Secondary: LGBTQ+ or Multicultural.

Typical Deadline: Submissions open March-January for books published in that year.

Why This Fits: Highly respected in the indie community. The book's complex genre-blending makes it a strong contender in multiple categories, highlighting its unique market position.

Requirements: Requires a published book (or ARC), entry fee, and submission through their online portal.

2. Independent Publisher Book Awards (IPPYs)

Recommended Category: Australia/New Zealand - Best Regional Fiction. Or: Thriller/Suspense Ebook.

Typical Deadline: Typically February/March annually.

Why This Fits: One of the largest and oldest indie book awards. The specific regional category for Australia is a perfect fit, and its thriller elements are strong enough for the genre category.

Requirements: Requires finished books, entry form, and fee. Multiple categories can be entered.

3. Davitt Awards (Sisters in Crime Australia)

Recommended Category: Best Adult Novel.

Typical Deadline: Typically closes in May for books published in the previous year.

Pitch articles and interviews to military-focused and feminist media outlets comparing Missouri's fictional journey to recent real-world news of women passing SAS, Green Beret, or other Tier 1 selection courses. Frame it as a fictional exploration of the psychological and physical toll.

Best Timing: Evergreen, but especially potent when new milestones for women in the military are in the news.

2. Fiction as a Frontline: Unpacking Australia-China Tensions Through an Espionage Thriller

Position the book as a 'must-read' for understanding the human element behind the headlines about AUKUS, cyber-espionage, and geopolitical maneuvering. Pitch to political commentators, international relations bloggers, and current affairs podcasts.

Best Timing: Immediately relevant and ongoing. Tie into specific news events like diplomatic meetings or security announcements.

3. Beyond Victimhood: A Novel's Nuanced Take on Sex Work, Agency, and Power

Engage in conversations on social media and in pitches to progressive/feminist outlets about the complex portrayal of sex work in the book. Contrast it with one-dimensional depictions in media, using the 'Themes and Tropes' section to pull specific examples of how the characters use it for agency and survival.

Best Timing: Evergreen, particularly relevant during debates around sex work decriminalization (e.g., SWERF discourse).

4. From the Outback to Beijing: An Indigenous Woman's Journey at the Center of a Global Thriller

Pitch to Australian media, particularly around NAIDOC Week or National Reconciliation Week. Highlight Bindi's story as a powerful example of contemporary Indigenous representation that subverts stereotypes and places a Noongar woman at the heart of an international plot.

Best Timing: Especially powerful during key cultural weeks in Australia, but also a strong evergreen angle for diversity in fiction.
